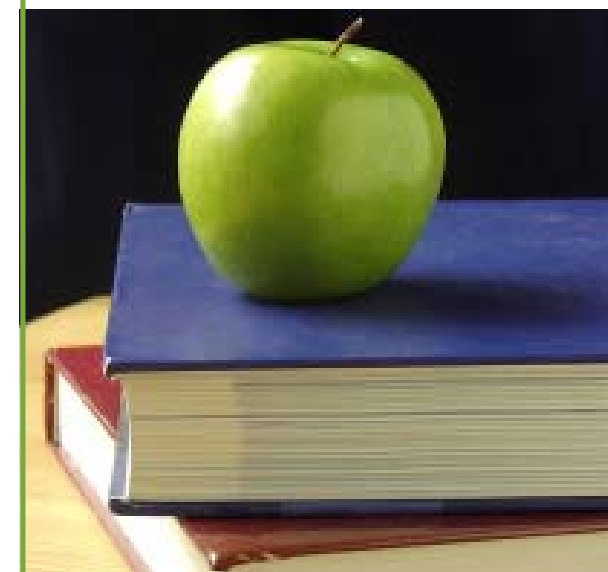

Early Childhood Program

Early Development, Psychopathology and Treatment of Infants and Young Children

A six-session, 18-CEU program for early childhood professionals.

Objectives:

- To become familiar with the *Diagnostic Classification: 0-3 Revised* (DC: 0-3R) as a diagnostic tool that guides understanding and treatment of young children aged birth to five years and their families.
- To understand the meaning of child-specific disruptive behavior disorders using the DC: 0-3R with special focus on how co-occurring diagnoses guide understanding and treatment.
- To become familiar with new research in neuro-development that guides understanding and treatment of children with typical development and those with behavior disorders.
- To gain a better understanding of the diagnosis and treatment of six subtypes of feeding disorders
- To understand and treat young children with problems in self-regulation, feeding and sleep.

CEU Credits

This program is eligible for 18 CEUs.
